About ASER

The Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) is a household survey of children's schooling status and their ability to do basic reading and arithmetic tasks. It has been facilitated by Pratham every year since 2005. ASER is carried out by volunteers from a local organisation in each district.

ASER 2018 reached 596 districts, 17,730 villages, 354,944 households and 546,527 children. 573 partners and approximately 30,000 volunteers participated in this effort.



2. State/UT pages for Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu, Puducherry, and Goa have not been presented in this report due to insufficient sample size.

3. Andhra Pradesh was bifurcated into Telangana and Andhra Pradesh in 2014. As a result, the sample frames of Census 2011 do not have the new state divisions. Of the 22 districts in undivided Andhra Pradesh, 9 rural districts are located in Telangana and the remaining 13 districts are located in Andhra Pradesh. ASER estimates for the two states are based on this separation of districts.

4. ASER 2018 was unable to reach some districts of Jammu, Kashmir, West Bengal, Arunachal Pradesh, Chattisgarh and Kerala due to logistical constraints and/or security concerns. 5. Maps may not be accurate or to scale. These are mere representations.
